number. Non-federal sponsors may also have requirements for acknowledgments and/or disclaimers.

Federal agencies' policy requirements set forth in Section 8136 of the Department of Defense Appropriations Act (Stevens Amendment), P.L. 100-463, enacted in October 1988 and section 511 of the fiscal year 1990 U.S. Department of Education Appropriations Act states:

"When issuing statements, press releases, requests for proposals, bid solicitations and other documents describing projects or programs funded in whole or in part with federal money, all grantees receiving federal funds, including but not limited to state and local governments, shall clearly state (1) the percentage of the total cost of the program or project which is financed with federal money, (2) the dollar amount of federal funds for the project or program, and (3) the percentage and dollar amount of the total costs of the project or program that will be funded by non-governmental sources."

Some agencies give formats for acknowledgment. Examples are:

NIH - <u>Communicating and Acknowledging Federal Funding</u>
Department of Energy - <u>Acknowledgements of Federal Support</u>
USDA - <u>Acknowledgment of USDA Support by NIFA</u>
NSF - Acknowledgements
